Witsies up their game at Track & Field USSA's

All things considered, it was a worthy performance by Wits' athletes in this year's USSA track & field champs. The event was hosted by TUT and staged at Pretoria's Pilditch Stadium on 25/26 April.

Despite several Wits competitors withdrawing at the last minute - citing academic commitments our small band of track and field athletes more than doubled last year's tally (5) to clock up 13 points.

Had he not been nursing an injury Menzi Mthembu would have bagged a better place in the long jump (jumping 7.52m to finish 4th) and in the triple jump (ending 7th with a jump of 14.98m). He soldiered on in the face of his coach's visible consternation. High jumper Ntando Mtshengu also narrowly missed a place, finishing 5th (2m). Middle distance runner Marko Bucarizza, by his own high standards, faded disappointingly to finish 7th in 14:52:11 in the men's 5 000m and 9th in 3:52:77 in the 1 500m.

Wits runners look to improve their rankings at the USSA cross country event this September, and hope to include women athletes such as Maryrose Aniegboka in the their squad.

Tournament organiser Hlumelo Rubushe writes that Wits Table Tennis Club (WTTC) hosted what will go down as one of the most entertaining and competitive tournaments in recent memory. Moses Mabhida's mortal remains are interred at the Novodevichye Cemetery in Moscow. But the struggle veteran after whom the venue of Wits' Nedbank Cup final demise is named would have turned in his grave at the poor quality of refereeing that robbed the Clever Boys' of at least taking the game to extra time on Saturday 17 May. The modest bloc of white-shirted travelling Wits supporters could scarcely believe their eyes.

Jabulani Shongwe's first-half goal to give Wits an early lead was itself fortuitous, for it became despite a blatant, redcardable tackle on Calvin Kadi.

Kermit Erasmus proved Wits' undoing in the end, though. His strikes in the 52nd and 71st minutes sandwiched former Clever Boy Sifiso Miyeni's effort twothirds into the match.

For their troubles, Wits walked away with the R2.5m runners'-up prize but had to wait until the next day, Sunday 18 May, for any further consolation. It came in the form of midfielder Sibusiso Vilakazi scooping three PSL 2014 awards: of the Season, Footballer Absa Premiership Players' Player of the Season and Nedbank Cup Player of the Tournament.

Reckoned along with Wits' highest-ever points tally in the PSL, 2014's proven a memorable first season for coach Gavin Hunt.
