WITS SCORES IN SUCCESSFUL 1st YEAR FOR UNIVERSITY SPORTS CO.



represented Wits at the USC

Ever wondered how all that exciting Varsity Sport comes to our playing fields and television screens? Top-level, televised student sports tournaments are the result of the establishment of the University Sports Company (USC). The USC was formed by member universities—currently 14 have signed up—and Advent Sport Entertainment & Media (ASEM) to develop and promote highperformance, tertiary-level sport competitions. It is inspired by the American college sports system. ASEM, founded by rugby legend Francois Pienaar, manages all the major Varsity Sports tournaments in a number of codes, including the Varsity Cup and Shield rugby competitions, and Varsity Prof Tawana Kupe, DVC Finance, Football, Hockey, Athletics and Netball.

At its 2014 AGM attended by Wits' Prof Tawana Kupe (DVC Finance), CEO Flip van Zyl reported that in its first full year of operation the USC paid R1.4m in preparation fees and prize money to member universities, from profits of R9.4m. The USC and ASEM share profits on a 50-50 basis. The USC declared a dividend of R3m to be shared amongst its member institutions. An amount of R1.1m will go to establishing the company's reserves.

In 2015 Wits will be represented in the rugby Varsity Shield and men's as well as women's Varsity Hockey series. Several new code competitions—basketball and T20 cricket among them—are expected to come on line in the next two years. Player eligibility, a source of contention in recent years, appears to have been resolved. Varsity Sports used the USSA bona fide student definition in 2013, and for 2014 an age limit of u-25 and a 'no athlete/player movement rule' were introduced. Other highlights reported to the AGM include implementing a new ticketing and vending system in 2014, and securing a dedicated Varsity Sports channel—210, or SuperSport Select—on DStv. Gauged by it's latest social media status, Varsity Sports' appeal is significant: @VarsityCup and @VarsitySportSA have, between them, more than 27 000 followers.

OTENG MEMORIAL TABLE TENNIS

Terrence Mathole entered the annals of Wits table tennis history when he beat companion Chijioke Osuji to win the Oteng Memorial men's singles title at Wits' New Squash Centre on Saturday 23 August.

On the day, Mathole was just too good for Osuji, winning the final by 4 sets to 3, and consigning his opponent to a heart-breaking defeat.

Both players entered the final knowing they could become only the second man to add the title of The Oteng Memorial Open Champion to their accolades following in the footsteps of Luke Abrahams, who has



won the tournament since its inception in 2011, but was unable to compete due to prior commitments. Osuji gave himself hope when he came from 3 -1 down to level the match at 3-3, but Mathole showed his class to take the final 14-12 and seal the win. The sportsmanship showed by Chijioke at the end was a great credit to one of South Africa's favourite champions, as he will certainly have been hurting. After his victory Mathole said: "To win is always a great feeling and today is no exception. I want to continue winning...[to] take my game to the next level." World Orienteering Championships - Italy
