Wits at a Glance

The University of the Witwatersrand (Wits) is located in Johannesburg, South Africa.

Wits is spread over **400 acres**, in Braamfontein and Parktown, has **11 libraries** and **18 residence** halls that hosts **6 486 beds**, accommodating **20%** of the student population.

Wits is structured into 5 faculties comprising of 36 schools, over 30 service departments and 3 416 courses offered.

Wits staff and students have access to 1 252 538 book volumes, 228 190 print and electronic journal titles, and 236 online databases.

Wits has one of the largest independent and open access archives in South Africa - the Historical Papers Research Archive, with 3 439 collections, some of which contain more than 2 000 archival boxes. Its archival digital repository, based on AtoM, to date contains our archival inventories, which are fully searchable. Moreover, a number of these collections have been fully digitised, and now include 32 985 digital objects, of which 29 830 are text documents in multi page PDF format, and 3 154 are photographs, as well as one audio file of Sol Plaatje's recording of Nkosi Sikelel' iAfrika, recorded in 1923.

Wits has two commercial companies, Wits Enterprise and the Wits Health Consortium, offering opportunities for contract research, short courses and tailor-made business solutions for the public and private sectors.




Total Number of NRF-Rated Researchers
















Total Number of SARChl Research Chairs and Postdoctoral Research Fellows





Distinctly Wits

- Wits develops the high level scarce skills required to transform society, the economy and our collective futures, by 2025, postgraduate students will make up 45% of Wits' student body.
- Witsies are fearless in their pursuit of new knowledge and innovation, are critical thinkers, problem-solvers, pioneers of science and agents of change. They are valued for their independence and ingenuity; their fight against injustice; their pioneering work in advancing the humanities and the sciences; and their strength in advancing economic development.
- The University owns the Sterkfontein Cave in the Cradle of Humankind World Heritage Site, the Wits Rural Facility in Mpumalanga, Pullen Farm which is located 35km south east of Nelspruit, and half of a private teaching hospital, the Wits Donald Gordon Medical Centre.
- The Origins Centre, a world class international tourist site at Wits, includes exhibitions on the Khoisan and Rock Art and tells the unique story of humankind's creativity. The University also boasts one of the largest and most diverse groups of geoscientists in Africa.
- Wits offers a range of services to the disabled community. The Wits Disability Rights Unit is a model centre for higher education institutions
 that caters for disabled students, while the Centre for Deaf Studies offers support and education to caregivers and families of the Deaf. The
 Emthonjeni Centre offers speech and hearing therapy, counselling and psychotherapy to the public and acts as a practical training ground for
 students in this area.

Achievements

The National Research
Foundation has bestowed
accolade on the School of
Mining Engineering by awarding
a C2 rating to Professor Rudrajit Mitra.

The **global standing** of the School of Mining Engineering has been boosted by another step up in the QS World University Rankings. **The Wits School of Mining Engineering** is the only mining school on the African continent to feature in the top 50 Mining Schools Worldwide (13th place in 2019).

The Wits Medical School is one of the best on the continent and, through the Wits Donald Gordon Medical Centre, we train more specialists and sub-specialists than any other university in southern Africa.

Wits flutist and music tutor,
Khanyisile Mthetwa has
been awarded the 2019
Myrna Brown International
Scholarship valued at \$3 000 by the
National Flute Association of America
(NFA). She performed at the
47th Annual National Flute
Association Convention as part
of winning the scholarship.

Africa's first Chair in Digital Business has been established at the Wits Business School through an initial five-year funding commitment from Telkom.

Tamlyn Naidu, a PhD candidate in the School of Chemical and Metallurgical Engineering at Wits, was named the international winner of the 2019 Young Persons' World Lecture Competition held in London on 10 October 2019. Wits students in the School of Electrical and Information Engineering (EIE), including Anita de Mello Koch and Kaamilah Desai, from the School of Computer Science and Applied Mathematics (CSAM) won various awards at the Centre for High Performance Computing (CHPC)'s 12th National Conference hosted in Cape Town in December 2019.

In 2019, the work of Wits University's Drama for Life (DFL)'s was recognised in Social Transformation in the Education and Skills Development category for bringing about positive change in society and Gauteng communities through their programmes. It won a bronze award at the Gauteng Premier's Service Excellence Awards.

In 2019, two Wits staff members, Prof. Yusuf Veriava and Prof. Thokozani Majozi added to the 19 Wits Alumni and Staff who have been awarded prestigious National Orders by the President for their continuing contribution to science, art and medicine in the country. This brought Wits to a total of 21 National Orders.

Nokwazi Mphuthi, a PhD candidate in the School of Physics, won the US award for the Best Emerging Research Journal Article.

The Royal society of Chemistry admitted NRF A-Rated Professor Roger Sheldon as an honorary fellow.


Quick Facts
