

The exhibition introduces the objects of modern architecture built in Kaunas in the 1920s and the 1930s as a doubtless achievement of the country's cultural, intellectual and state maturity.

During two decades Kaunas was the capital of Lithuania, thus developing from a marginal provincial town into an important architectural centre of the region, which was following the modern architecture of interwar Europe and interpreting it in local context.

The exhibition seeks to show how seamlessly, in twenty years, the architects of a young country blended into the European architectural context, represented Lithuania and contributed to the development of a modern European state.
