RISK, COMPLIANCE AND GOVERNANCE LAW Recent events in the financial sector have re-emphasised the need for heightened efforts aimed at promoting, developing, managing and maintaining risk management controls across all the sector as well as individual institutions' activities. Attaining these objectives necessitates, among other core elements, individuals who have a complete grasp of new and rapidly changing global and local initiatives, processes and procedures that ensure that a financial institution's activities are compliant with legal and regulatory requirements. The Risk, Compliance and Governance Law postgraduate Description certificate course seeks to reinforce and embed knowledge of how to design, implement and maintain financial institutions' internal and external systems of control. It is aimed at individuals in the banking, pensions, insurance and capital markets who are tasked with promoting the demanding and complex task of fulfilling risk and compliance awareness culture in their organisations. It is also suitable for individuals who would want to acquire an in-depth understanding of relevant laws and regulations and other internal procedures that enhance compliance with good governance.
