





Developing Leadership in Digital Government



COURSE BRIEF

This is a practitioner led 4-week course that covers practical implementation of Digital leadership. The course is targetted at senior management executives in the public service, these are the individuals involved in the strategy formulation, planning and oversight within their organisations. The targetted individuals are permanent Exco members who are in a position to influence the strategic direction of the organisation and are able to either champion or oversee the implementation of a digitalisation strategy within their organisations. In short, the following role players will benefit the most from this course:

- **Director Generals, Head of Departments, CEOs** or equivalents - Digital transformation offers organisations multitude of benefits and if it is championed from the top, it has a better chance of success. It is easily integrated to the way of doing business within an organisation instead of just another ICT department's initiative.
- 2 Deputy Director Generals or executives in charge of corporate services - In most public entities, this is the executive in charge of the full value chain for Finance, Programmes and ICT. As such this role is best positioned to champion a digital transformation journey.
- **3 Director Generals in charge of Core Businesses** – Digital leadership should be at the core of transforming the operations of the organisation i.e. the new way of doing business and not the use of ICT to do the current business. As such, if core business executives lead the process, organisations will reap the benefits quicker and less change management complexities will be experienced from the top management.
- Chief Financial Officers, CIOs, General
 Managers (Strategy, Planning, Project Office)
 these are all key members of exco with a direct influence on the strategic direction of any entity.
- 5 Chief Directors or Senior Managers and other influential role players in the leadership value chain of the organisations.

WHAT TO EXPECT FROM THE COURSE:

- 1. Conceptual understanding and appreciation of the value of digital transformation.
- 2. A toolkit (concepts, frameworks, current regulations) to enable course attendants to champion digital leadership, design digital strategies, lead digitalisation projects, oversee digital transformation strategies, appreciate and champion good ICT governance.
- Practical case studies on how other countries are or have leveraged on digital transformation to improve public service delivery and how the experiences can be adopted for the South African context.
- 4. Functional understanding and appreciation of the modern technologies in improving efficiency and accelerating service delivery in the public service (service based architectures, AI, Robotics, Cloud Computing, Virtual and Augmented Reality and others under 4IR).
- 5. Full appreciation of the Cybersecurity risks in the digital space and available tools to combat these risks.
