OUTLINE

Day 1

On the first day of the programme, delegates are introduced to the dynamic field of health research, where they gain insights into its various types and methodologies, as well as a foundational overview of Clinical Trials, delving into the significance, processes, and considerations.

Day 2

On day two, delegates explore current trends and challenges in health research, alongside discussions on research ethics, regulations, and protocol development.

Day 3

Day three focuses on management essentials for delegates, covering the pivotal role of managers, effective communication techniques, performance management strategies, and team development dynamics. Delegates learn to foster open dialogue, set clear objectives, and cultivate high-performing teams, gaining essential skills for effective leadership and organisational success.

Day 4

Day four of the programme focuses on clinical leadership, highlighting clinician researcher pathways, the role of clinical scientists, and the importance of statistics in healthcare research.

Day 5

On the final day, delegates delve into foundational topics including grant applications and management, budgeting, and academic entrepreneurship. They learn key elements of successful grant proposals, effective budget allocation, and the entrepreneurial mindset necessary to translate research into practical solutions.
