Increased rainfall and temperature variability, and extreme events over the short term will have increasingly adverse effects on key sectors of South Africa's economy and the population at large, particularly the poor and vulnerable,

Provincial Climate Change Policy mandate

 Each province will develop a *climate response strategy*, which evaluates provincial *climate risks and impacts* and seeks to give effect to the National Climate Change Response Policy at provincial level.

 Climate change considerations and constraints will be integrated into development plans, growth strategies, regulatory frameworks and service delivery programmes.
