## New approach to capacity building










- Not all information is <u>relevant</u>

- Need determines significance

#### Learning so far...

- Identifying the right people, then building trust and relationships is essential – but time-consuming
  - Patience and negotiation to overcome resistance
  - Difficulty of predicting rate of progress (M&E)
- Social learning requires
  - Commitment from all parties
  - Openness and willing to see others' viewpoints
- Huge rewards in effective co-production
  - At individual level
  - Hope to also see at systemic level (watch this space!)





- Learning priorities and contexts are different from one city/region to the next
- Terminology (common understanding/language) is very important
- "Big plans" are made in the office/behind a computer... going to a place and engaging with people on the ground changes perspectives/priorities
- Acknowledging the importance of ongoing dialogue, the value of well-structured interactions is immeasurable
