Helpful Information to obtain Digital/Electronic Transcripts and Certificates from various Higher Education Institutions

Below is some helpful information or links should you need assistance with obtaining your academic record and degree certificate. It is important to note that Wits requires all academic documents to be certified (not older than 3 months). Alternatively, you can arrange for the institutions to email the academics documents directly to your assigned admission consultant and <u>applications.senc@wits.ac.za</u>. If we receive the documents directly from the institution we will not require them to be certified.
