Central Applications Clearing House (CACH)

Please note that the Department of Higher Education and Training has introduced the Central Applications Clearing House (CACH) service for matriculants unable to secure a place at the educational institution of their choice. The CACH facility records prospective students' information and submits it to relevant universities. If places are available and applicants meet the requirements, institutions will contact students to offer them places. NB: This is a guideline only. Meeting the requirements does not guarantee a place. Final selection is made subject to the availability of places, academic results and other entry requirements where applicable.

Wits tabulates the Admission points score (APS) for all subjects on the following basis:

That English must be taken either as Home Language or as 1st Additional Language.

Mathematics is compulsory for all numerate programmes in Engineering and the Built Environment, Commerce, Law and Management, and Science.

Maths Literacy is accepted for some degrees

Wits does not distinguish between designated vs non-designated subjects when calculating the APS.

The APS calculation is based on the **best seven subjects** including Life Orientation, and must include required faculty-specific subjects.
